INTRODUCTION:

The Institution of Engineers (India) established in 1920, is the largest body of professional engineers in India with total membership of about 6,48,000 encompassing 15 engineering divisions and one Interdisciplinary division. IE (I), one of the largest professional associations in the World, obtained Royal Charter from King George V in 1935 to promote and advance the science, practice and business Engineering in all its branches in India. IE (I) has been fulfilling its obligations through 101 Centres in the Country and 5 Overseas Chapters with numerous technical activities at the International, National State and Regional level for the past 91 years. IE (I) holds every year National Conventions in each branch of Engineering to bring out the latest trends and future projections.

The Textile Engineering Division Board of IE (I) so far organized Twenty Four National Conventions of Textile Engineers on contemporary themes. The Twenty Fifth National Convention of Textile Engineers will be organized by the Andhra Pradesh State Centre on 24th and 25th February, 2012 in the form of a National Seminar on “The Emerging Trends in Textiles and Handlooms”. This Seminar provides an opportunity to bring the Experts, Industrialists, Engineers and business people from Textile Engineering sectors, academia and industry associations on a common platform to share their experiences.

Theme of the Convention:

THE EMERGING TRENDS IN TEXTILES AND HANDLOOMS”

The Indian Textile Industry is one of the largest and oldest sectors which contributes in the country economy in terms of output, investment and employment. The sector employs nearly 38 million people thus us the second highest employer after agriculture. Its importance is underlined by the fact that it accounts for around 4% of Gross Domestic Product, 14% of industrial production, 9% of excise collections, 18% of employment in the industrial sector, and 16% of the country's total exports earnings. With direct linkages to the rural economy and the agriculture sector, it has been estimated that one of every six households in the country depends on this sector, either directly or indirectly for its livelihood.

Indian handloom industry has a glorious and finest hand crafted textiles in olden days inviting worldwide attention & application. Andhra Pradesh is no exception producing some of the exotic hand woven fabrics with the deft hands of the weavers. Irrespective of the fact, that it occupies a pride place, it has also undergone lots of challenges over the years which are to be addressed a revival measures initiated.

The Textile Industry comprises majority of natural fibres like cotton, jute, silk, wool etc. and manmade fibres like Polyester, acrylic, nylon etc and these have a direct bearing on the various sections of the population since it involves right from farmers upto the consumer. The textile manufacturing industry is broadly divided into five categories say (1) fibre producers, (2) yarn manufacturer's, (3) fabric weaver's, (4) Processors and (5) garment makers.

All these groups though work under a same textile umbrella, are facing various hurdles either individually or jointly from time to time. Such **sudden surges** affect the existence of the Industry itself very often. Some recent surges are: The subsequent global melt down, subsequent crash in foreign currency, The petroleum price hike, erratic monsoon, affecting crops and also the power supply, The recent adhoc Govt. policy of restricting trade practices, Acute shortage of skilled workforce, Growing awareness of pollution measures. Stringent banking norms irrespective of market conditions. Lack of adequate research on consumer acceptance in terms of fashion, design, trends etc. and some of the problems to be faced by the industry.

In view of the above, this National Convention of textile Engineers proposes to bring all the stake holders; the cotton growers, ginners, spinners, weavers, processors, garment makers, the associations, Govt. agencies and the bankers, on a common platform to debate on the theme of the Convention by sharing the experiences of overcoming the surges and finding out the ways and means of surviving such sudden surges in future.

OBJECTIVE:

The main objective of the convention is to bring in the views of the various stake holders of the Industry to formulate jointly a common policy to develop an immunity of the system to prevent major crisis of the industry as a whole and to withhold the unavoidable surge.

The recent anomalies are a result of the misunderstanding and error on judgement on the magnitude of the crisis within the stake holders like the yarn manufacturer's and garment manufacturers, Pollution Control Board and the industry etc.

The programme of the National Seminar will consist of Inaugural Session, Six Technical Sessions, Panel Discussion and Valedictory Session. Shri S N Bhaduri Memorial Lecture will be delivered by eminent experts from the interdisciplinary fields of Textile Engineering field. Experts from both industries and academia-research are being approached to deliver Invited lectures broadly on the theme and following sub-themes of the National Seminar. Besides the Invited Talks, a limited number of selected technical papers are planned for presentation in the Convention.

 Cotton Ginners – impact of international domestic trends
- b. Spinners – managing stocks, market plan, handling lenders
 &
 Yarn traders – market practices Local / Exports and Govt. Policies
- ii) a. Weaver – yarn price and fabric price trends
- b. Traders / Stockists – Lead time and consumption trends.
- iii) a. Processors – Govt. Norm, Cap Cost/ Operation cost and practicality
 &
 Impact of closure of process houses in Textile supply chain.
- b. Garment – Lead Time, costing and matching international trends
 &
 Rationality on Export dependency, domestic projected trends.
- iv) a. Consumption trends – health awareness, safety application
- b. Engineering applications and potential
 &
- c. Contribution to consumption – role of Govt./ Govt. Undertakings.
- v. Indian Handlooms in general & A P Handlooms in particular issues & developments, cluster programmes, R & D Design & Product Development, Training & Skill Development etc.
- vi) Fashion & Textiles, Trends, forecasting as per international market etc.
- vii) (a) Surface Engineering – Value addition, revival of tradition & heritage in handlooms.
- (b) Futuristic textiles, its impact to the industry, use of man made fibre for product diversification etc.
